What is HFW?

- National evidence-based model
- Family at the center of the team
- Use family strengths & family voice to develop family-driven plan towards wellness
- Builds families up & supports families to self-advocate through coaching and partnership
- Over time, increase empowerment of families as lead & decrease role of HFW Care Manager
- HFW Care Manager as family partner & facilitator of process
- HFW Care Manager supports care team in their role as a resource to the family
- HFW Care Manager assists in building the care team (natural supports, schools, therapists, parent advocates, medical professionals, etc)
- HFW Care Manager gradually supports the family in taking over collaboration and coordination with team

What are eligibility criteria?

- School-aged youth (ages 5-20) residing in Yates County
- Diagnosed Serious Emotional Disturbance
- Medicaid *or* non-Medicaid eligible
- Willingness to engage in the HFW process
- Involved in multiple systems (behavioral health, child welfare, special education, juvenile justice, addiction services, child health, etc) in the last 6 months
- Has CANS-NY high acuity (HFW Care Manager or SPOA can assess for this)
- Is at risk of higher level of care as shown by one or more of the following:
 - Is at risk of out-of-home care and treatment due to challenges living in the home and community
 - In the past 6 months, was assessed for or was in out-of-home care and treatment due to challenges living in the home and community
 - In the past 6-12 months, had multiple visits with 911, emergency room, mobile crisis / CPEP, emergency respite, Home-Based Crisis Intervention (HBCI)
 - In the past 6 months, had change in childcare, aftercare, or school due to significant behavioral issues related to mental health needs
